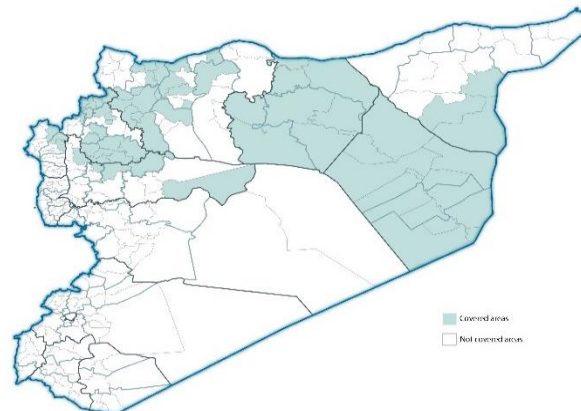


Highlights

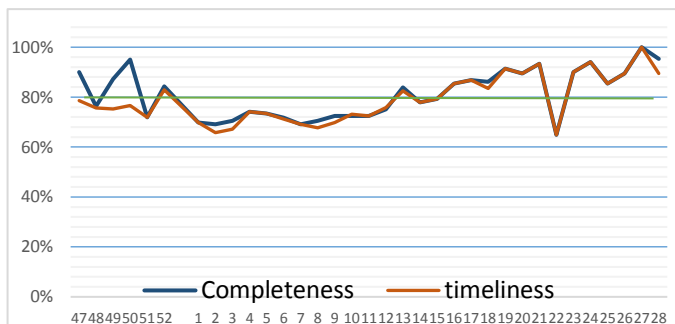
- During Epi-week no 28, 2014; 94.1% (144/153) of the health facilities across 7 Governorates provided surveillance data 81,6% of reporting sites submitted the weekly reports on time.
- The total number of consultations reported during the reporting week was 48008 (including 40% children under the age of five) compared to 47681 consultations during week 27. The leading cause of morbidity was FUO (Fever of Unknown Origin), with over 539 cases (1.12%).
- 117 measles cases reported in this week, the total number decreased, line list collected by name and age and district, started at week No 4.
- As of week 28, 5 new AFP (Acute Flaccid Paralysis) cases reported, 35 AFP cases reported in 2014 up to date. See weekly Poliomyelitis outbreak report for more details.
- Common disease reported under others were URTI (upper respiratory tract infection), acute bronchiolitis, whooping cough, acute diarrhea, Brucellosis and Cutaneous leishmaniasis.

ACU EWARN covers 71/150 sub-District in 7 governorate. The total population currently under surveillance is about 7.189.528



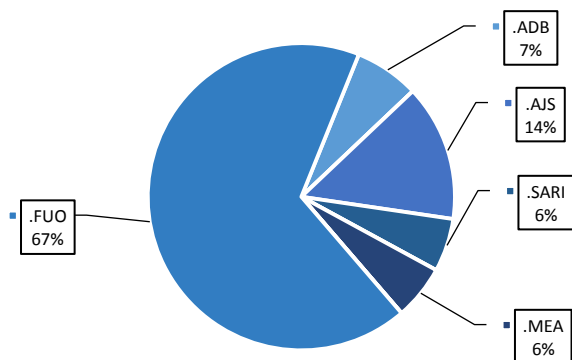

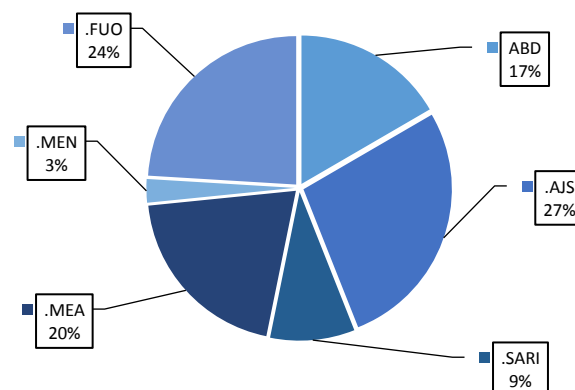

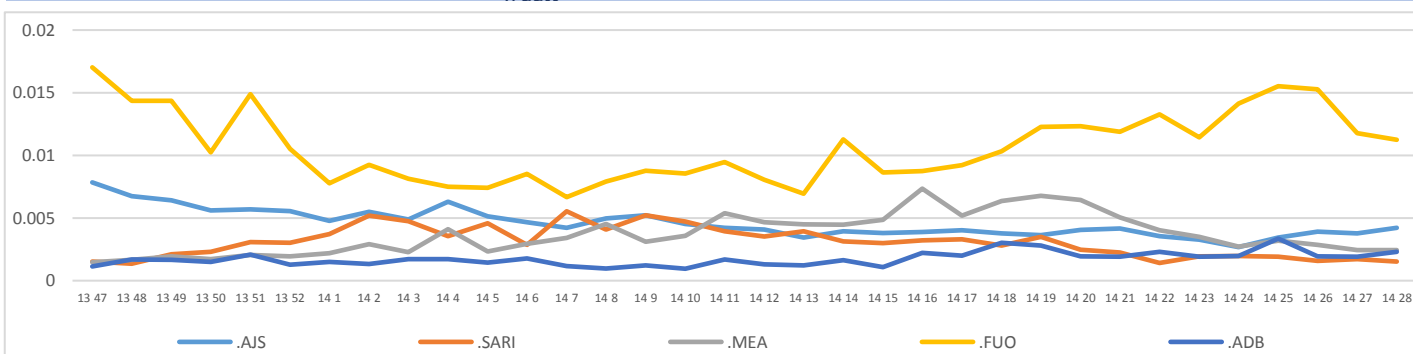
Proportion of morbidities among >5Y



Proportion of morbidities among <5Y

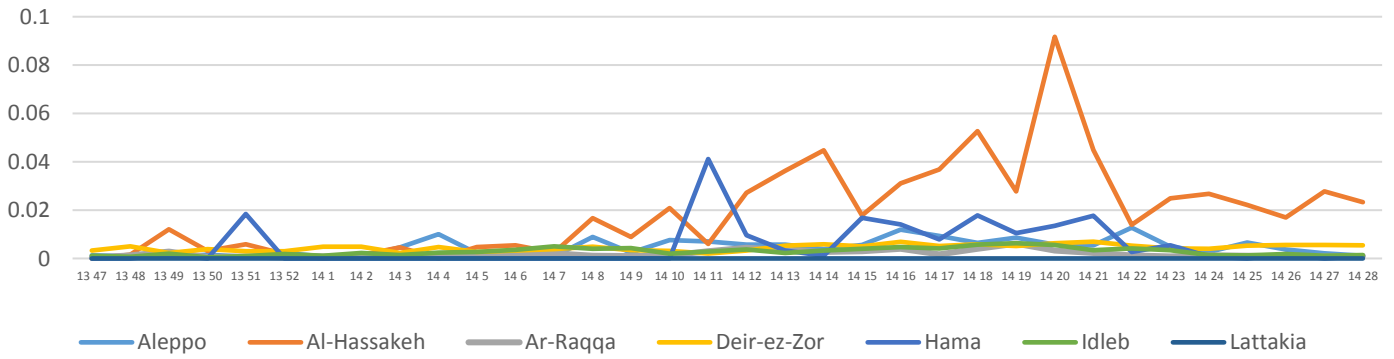


Trends for Leading Priority Diseases in 7 Governorates – Epi week 47, 2013 to Epi week 28 2014
